The Indian School Corridor Citywide Fight Back Business and Homeowners Association was formed in July, 2007 to change a Citywide policy for policing and prosecution

If a person is arrested in the city of Phoenix, we want them to know that our laws have teeth. That the police *will* discover their criminal history; the prosecutors *will* take this history seriously and prosecute vigorously; and the judges *will* sentence accordingly with the maximum penalty. This is the essence of what is known as Broken Windows Method of Policing and Prosecution. It has worked in NYC and can certainly work here in Phoenix.

We are not just a faceless city, but one giant neighborhood and we want equality on this simple point: to "Require the Prior" and sentence accordingly, whether it's a misdemeanor or felony, whether the neighborhood is rich or poor, black, brown, or white.

We don't want to be the fifth largest city in the country if we can't be in the top five for safety – both personal and economic - the foundation stones for all quality of life. Wherever Broken Windows is implemented, prosperity always follows.

Our Association has taken a leadership role in bringing this policing and prosecution issue to our Government Officials, City Services, Courts, and Police, and has built a coalition of trust and cooperation. We have been working together as partners to reduce crime on the Indian School Corridor and are already seeing positive results.

Going Forward

Now is the time to build upon this successful partnership and make the Indian School Corridor a retail and dining destination that becomes the bridge between Scottsdale and Central Phoenix.

Indian School Road is only one mile south of some of the most expensive real estate in the city. Even in this less than stellar economy, working together, we can parlay our geographic proximity to Camelback Road into a success story for our businesses and residents; and therefore the entire city due to increased sales tax revenue and business infill. What's good for us will be good for the entire city, just as it has been in policing and prosecution.

Working together, businesses, homeowners, and the City; we can attract the kinds of high end national retail shops and local specialty boutiques that will compliment the luxury shopping found on the Camelback Corridor and entice that clientele to make the Indian School Corridor part of their retail and dining habit.

We can reflect the affluence and prosperity of Camelback Road even as we keep our own personality.

Together, we can create a positive impact for generations to come.
