Dear Judge Leonard,

We, the undersigned businesses, request that you sentence the defendant, [REDACTED] to the highest degree allowed by law. It should be clear to see after looking at his conviction record that we and our customers have been repeatedly victimized by the defendant. His 35 convictions, which fall almost entirely in the same one square mile with 32nd Street and Indian School Road as its epicenter, clearly indicates that this individual is not interested in the rule of law, nor does he appreciate the court's leniency in sentencing to which he has become so well accustomed.

This defendant's constant return to our doorsteps, parking lots, and places of business has negatively impacted our customers' perceptions of their safety in the area we try to do business; their perception of the quality of our businesses; and as a result, has caused the loss of customers and subsequent revenue because of his repeated criminal trespassing.

Judge Leonard, we pay our taxes, we support our families, and we obey the law. At this point it would certainly be fair for us to conclude that this individual is being permitted to repeatedly prey on us and our customers because a.) The court doesn't take seriously the impact of his crimes against us, and b.) The defendant has not felt the court's sentencing to be a significant enough penalty to cause him to change his criminal behavior.

We need this revolving door of abuse against us and our customers to stop.
